<b>Can</b> (be able to)	ability, doubt, astonishment permission, polite request	You <b>can</b> do it You <b>could</b> do it	He <b>can't</b> be 15. He looks much older
<b>May</b> (to be allowed to)	permission, if not prohibition, supposition with doubt	We <b>may</b> go We <b>might</b> go	
<b>Must</b>	obligation, firm necessity, logical conclusion, probability	We <b>must</b> do it He <b>must</b> be ill	
<b>Shall</b>	intention, supposition	I <b>shall</b> do it He <b>shall</b> arrive home by Monday	
<b>Will</b>	wish, desire, will, confidence in the future	I <b>will</b> go there I <b>would</b> go there	
<b>Ought to</b>	moral duty, insistent advice, strict recommendation	You <b>ought to</b> write this letter	
<b>Need</b>	(un)necessity	<b>Need</b> he work so late? We <b>need</b> not have hurried	
<b>Dare</b>	impertinence	How <b>dare</b> you speak to me? He <b>dare</b> not tell it to me	
<b>Used to</b>	repeated action in the past	He <b>used to</b> live in London	
<b>Should</b>	necessity, advice, blame, recommendation, reproach, regret	He <b>should</b> not smoke so much. You <b>should</b> not cut your hair	
<b>Would</b>	wish (with "to like"), polite request, a habit of the past	<b>Would</b> you like to come again? <b>Would</b> you mind?	
<b>Have to</b>	unwillingness, forced circumstances	I <b>have to</b> do it I <b>had to</b> do it yesterday I'll <b>have to</b> do it tomorrow	
<b>Be to</b>	obligation arising out of arrangement or agreement	I <b>am to</b> read it I <b>was to</b> read it I shall <b>be to</b> read it	



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
